



Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time. Matthew 5: 17-37

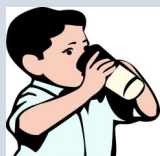
Jesus talks about the Commandments and keeping the law. He tells his followers that they must settle their debts and disputes with others or fear not being welcomed by God when the time comes.
